Enduring constant physical abuse, she bravely sought assistance from the Women's Crisis Centre, a period that led to depression and a significant loss of self-confidence.

Today, Lakshmi has found a renewed sense of peace and purpose with her four children, embracing what she considers a new chapter in her life, marked by a healthier relationship and a completely transformed self-perception.

A pivotal moment in her journey was her enrolment in the six-week "Confident Woman" program at the Almanah Hope Centre in 2023. "I have learnt so many things from this program!" she exclaimed with joy upon graduating in September. Lakshmi shared the profound relief she experienced in exploring her roots and tracing her life's path, ultimately leading to a deeper understanding of her true self.

These learnings have been instrumental in rebuilding her self-esteem and fostering a sense of stability within her family.

Lakshmi now stands as a beacon of hope, actively encouraging other women in their own journeys. She passionately urges those facing despair to seize the empowering opportunity offered by the Almanah Hope Centre.
